St. Mary's Catholic Primary School Curriculum Letter Summer Term 2018 Year Two



Welcome back

I hope you all had an enjoyable Easter holiday and are looking forward to the Summer term and the exciting activities planned as part of our whole school topic called 'Budding Builders and Marvellous Makers'. This letter is an overview of the work we will be covering in class over the next two terms and also includes important dates and times of some events that will take place. We are happy to see parents to discuss any problems or queries concerning your child. Please do not hesitate to contact the school to arrange an appointment, which is convenient to both parties.

RE	At St Mary's we follow the 'Learning and Growing as People of God'
	curriculum strategy. This term we will be looking at the Resurrection and
	thinking about how different people would have felt. The children will also
	be looking at Pentecost and learning about the Holy Trinity. We will then
	be learning about the different parts of the Mass and the importance of
	gathering as a parish community. During all the topics that we will be
	covering, children will be able to use religious words and phrases to describe
	some religious actions and symbols as well as talking and reflecting on their
	own experiences and feelings.
Literacy	In Literacy, different topics will be covered which include narrative, non-
	fiction and poetry.

<u>Narrative</u>

We will be looking at The Three Little Pigs, retelling the story in different ways and interviewing characters. We will then change the story and write our own version including time connectives, adverbs and a range of descriptive language. We will be focussing on developing sentence structure and content to make sentences more interesting and exciting to read. In addition to this, we will learn about how similes can be used to add extra detail to descriptive writing.

Non-fiction

The focus for non-fiction writing this term will be on diary entries and this will link to our trip to Legoland. The children will create their own diary entry of the day.

Information texts

The children will create an explanation text linked to the 'Wacky Windmill' they will create in DT. They will look at the features of an explanation text and will use these in their own piece of writing. Children will also create instructions on how to make the perfect potion based on 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl.

Phonics	Children in Key Stage 1 are taught in groups for phonics. There is a phonics

	lesson every day. We follow the Letters and Sounds phonics programme for
	the teaching of phonics, which is a synthetic phonics programme advocated
	by the Government. We also use Phonics Play, which includes a range of
	online activities, to support our teaching. As with all subjects, we closely
	monitor and assess pupil progress in phonics and will discuss any concerns
	with you.
Reading	At St Mary's we use the Oxford Reading Tree scheme, which includes a
	range of fiction and non-fictions texts. The books are banded according to
	level of difficulty in terms of decoding words and understanding of the text
	into different colour bands. Each child will be heard to read at school,
	which will be recorded in your child's reading diary. Encourage your child
	to read daily at home, keeping a note of books read in their personal
	reading record. Please ensure that your child's reading book and reading
	record are in school every day, even if they have not finished reading the
	book. Reading books will be changed on a regular basis and we will
	continually monitor the progress of each child's reading.
Maths	This term's Maths work will cover a range of areas including multiplication
	and division, measures including weight, capacity, and direction. In
	addition and subtraction, we will be consolidating our understanding and
	use of written methods and applying these to solve word problems. Children
	will begin sorting 2D and 3D shapes against different criteria. Children will
	be also be working on learning and recalling the 2, 5 and 10 times tables so
	please continue to practice these at home.
Science	Children will learn about what a plant needs to grow. As part of this topic,
	we will be growing our own sunflowers and comparing how different plants
	grow. We will also be looking at the different parts of a plant and describing
	function as well as conducting a fair test. Children will learn about current
	issues facing our environment such as climate change, recycling and
ØØ.	endangered animals.
\mathcal{PE}	This term we will be focusing on Athletics. We will be building on skills such
	as agility, balance and co-ordination. Children will also be creating different
	dance routines individually and in teams. It is <u>vital</u> that you label all
	school clothing with your child's name to avoid confusion when they change
	for P.E. Children should wear shorts and a t-shirt for outdoor games as it is
	getting warmer. Please make sure your child has a pair of trainers for the
	games lessons. Children should not wear earrings for PE. Our PE lesson will
	continue to be on a Tuesday afternoon.
Computing	This term we will be learning how to use Scratch Junior to create a dance
	routine. The children will be using logical reasoning to predict the
	behaviour of simple programs and create and debug simple programs. They
	will also program a Bluebot through a given course, using a sequence of
	steps to reach the end.
Geography	Children will develop key map skills through a range of engaging
3::0::3::9	geographical skill based activities. Children will explore a range of maps at
	a local, national and global level, developing their understanding of how to
	n went, initiating and govern teres, developing their understanding of 100 to

	navigate around an atlas to find key countries, continents, oceans and seas
	along with devising their own maps and routes. We will also be looking at
	the affect that humans have on the environment.
Art	Children will be learning to collage using a range of materials. They will be
	designing and making their own robot. Children will be painting in
	different styles using a range of strokes and colours. They will begin by
	mixing and creating colours to create a fantastic piece of art.
\mathcal{DT}	In our DT topic this term, children will explore different ways of making
	windmill bases and sails with craft materials. They will be learning how to
	join materials together and make axles allowing sails to spin in the wind.
	They will also have the opportunity to design and make their own wacky
	windmill.
PSHE	Children will be creating the perfect recipe to build the perfect friendship.
	They will then develop and build on collaborative thinking and decision
	making skills. Children will also begin talking about change and how we can
	build a positive attitude towards change.
Music	Children will be able to use their body parts to create sounds. They will then
	begin to use percussion instruments to imitate well known sounds. Children
	will create a soundscape to a well-known story.
